## Part 4: What About Hell?

• 23% of those claiming to have Near-Death Experiences have a terrifying experience.

But this figure may be far lower than the actual number. Why? Most people who have a negative experience don't want to talk about it. The experience leaves them terrified and ashamed.

More than that, these horrifying experiences produce such emotional trauma that the individual often suppresses the memory of it in the subconscious mind.

"But how can a loving God send anyone to hell?"
