"For I know the plans I have for you,"
declares the Lord,
"plans to prosper you and not harm you,
plans to give you a future and a hope!"
(Jeremiah 29:11)

Expect God's Favor

God's promise: "Whoever finds Me, finds life and receives *favor* from the Lord." (Proverbs 8:35)

"May the *favor* of the Lord our God rest upon us and give us success." (Psalm 90:17)

"God has crowned us with glory and favor." (Psalm 8:5)

"God wants to pour out the incredible wealth of His *favor* and kindness upon us." (Ephesians 2:7)

Definition

Favor: to assist, to provide with special advantages, to receive preferential treatment.

God wants to make your life easier. We should expect preferential treatment, not because of **who** we are, but because of **whose** we are. We can expect things to work to our advantage because of who our Father is.

You've got an advantage in life. You've got an edge. You have the favor of God.

How to Raise Your Level of Expectation

1. Program your mind
"Set your mind and keep it set on the higher things." (Col. 3:2)
