Part 1: Know Who You Are

In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim King of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon came to Jerusalem and besieged it. (Daniel 1:1)

The most important verse in the Book of Daniel is: **But there is a God in Heaven.** (Daniel 2:28)

Then the king ordered Ashpenaz, chief of his court officials, to bring into the king's service some of the Israelites from the royal family and nobility ... (Daniel 1:3)

Who did they select? "Young men without any physical defect, handsome, showing aptitude for every kind of learning, well informed, quick to understand, and qualified to serve in the king's palace. (Daniel 1:4)

He was to teach them the language and literature of the Babylonians. (Daniel 1:4)

The king assigned them a daily amount of food and wine from the king's table. They were to be trained for three years, and after that they were to enter the king's service. (Daniel 1:5)

The chief official gave them new names: to Daniel, the name Belteshazzar. (Daniel 1:7)

- Daniel: God is my Judge. The El in Daniel stands for Elohim, the Hebrew name for God.
- **Belteshazzar: Bel Protect the King.** Bel is the most powerful of the Babylonian gods.

Now the king assigned them a daily amount of food and wine from the king's table. (Daniel 1:5)

But Daniel resolved not to defile himself with royal food and wine, and he asked the chief official for permission not to defile himself this way. (Daniel 1:8)

"Please test your servants for ten days: Give us nothing but vegetables to eat and water to drink. Then compare our appearance with that of the young men who eat the royal food and treat your servants in accordance with what you see." So the chief official agreed to this and tested them for ten days. (Daniel 1:12-14)

At the end of the ten days, they looked healthier and better nourished than any of the young men who ate the royal food. (Daniel 1:15)
